I-66 Trail Talking Points

The I-66 Trail is a project that is part of Virginia Department of Transportation's (VDOT) <u>I-66 expansion</u> <u>outside the Beltway</u>. Below are a few key talking points related to the trail development process and the trail design.

Trail Design

The trail should be outside of the soundwall.

 Current designs have 3-5 miles of trail inside the sound wall, exposed to air pollution, noise, and debris.)

There should be sufficient access points to the trail.

 Current designs show access points as far apart as a half mile, which is inconvenient and potentially dangerous.

The barrier between the interstate and the trail needs to be well-designed.

• The barrier needs to be taller than 36 inches, and the barrier needs to be topped with a soundproof wall.

Impact to Northern Virginians

This project impacts more than just the homeowners who live next to it.

- All Northern Virginia residents are affected by this interstate expansion project—that's one of VDOT's justifications for spending billions of dollars on it.
- This is a multi-billion dollar contract.
- Those who walk and bike need to benefit from that investment.

We want our tax money to be used wisely.

- ALL Virginia taxpayers are financing the project.
- We all have a stake in this.
- It is wasteful to build a trail that is unpleasant to use and harmful to public health.

When well-designed, trails are vital pieces of a transportation network.

Process

This trail will be around for many decades.

• We have to ensure it's done right.
